We will give preference to papers in this area, but papers from all areas of American Philosophy are welcome.

The deadline for submissions is **January 1, 2016**. This is a firm deadline. We will stop accepting submissions at midnight Pacific Standard Time on January 1, 2016. Please submit your paper or proposal following the guidelines below:

Papers should be no longer than 3000 words. Longer papers will not be considered.

Submissions must include a 100-150 word abstract. Accepted papers will be presented in their entirety by the author during a session and, in most cases, will be followed by a ten minute commentary and a period of open discussion.

(2) Document with paper prepared for blind review (please do not include any information about your submission itself in the body of the e-mail).

Please note that multiple submissions will not be accepted and that persons participating in invited sessions or on the main program may not submit to the graduate student panel.
