In this occasion, our symposium will be held in Chiapas. This Southern state is an extremely significant place given its history of liberation, which, since the resistance against the Spanish invasion, has demanded the establishment of a more just and dignified world for all. In this place of enunciation, it is necessary—through the creative articulation with other disciplines and knowledges—to find and develop relevant philosophical categories to diagnose the evils of the era in which we live. Thus, our Symposium aims to think through anticapitalist and decolonial strategic alternatives originated in the global South from new interpretations of the different cultural traditions of the world.

SUBMISSIONS

Abstract should clearly state the main points of the argument to be presented. They should be written in Spanish and have a maximum length of 250 words. In order to submit your abstract, complete the registration form available at: http://afm.org.mx/congreso-2016/solicitud-de-registro/ please make sure you correctly send your submission by choosing "Filosofía de la liberación" on the Coloquio window. The deadline for submissions is April 3, 2016.

After a review process, letters of acceptance will be sent during the month of May. Priority will be given to submissions that propose creative and innovative treatments of philosophy of liberation by clarifying the major current problems. For participants not fluent in Spanish, the papers may be presented in English. However, in this circumstance, prior to the presentation, the author should provide the audience with a two-page summary of the essay in Spanish.
