philosophical debate concerning The virtuality has privileged SO far metaphysical issues, asking whether or not virtual spaces and objects should be considered as real or illusory. But beyond this question, there is no doubt that the virtual constitutes an essential dimension of our lives, linked also - but not only - to the technological mediations that structure life in contemporary societies.

But what does it mean to experience 'virtuality'? What is the significance of virtuality for our culture? What is the relationship between art and virtuality? This and other questions will be the starting point for the discussions during these days.
