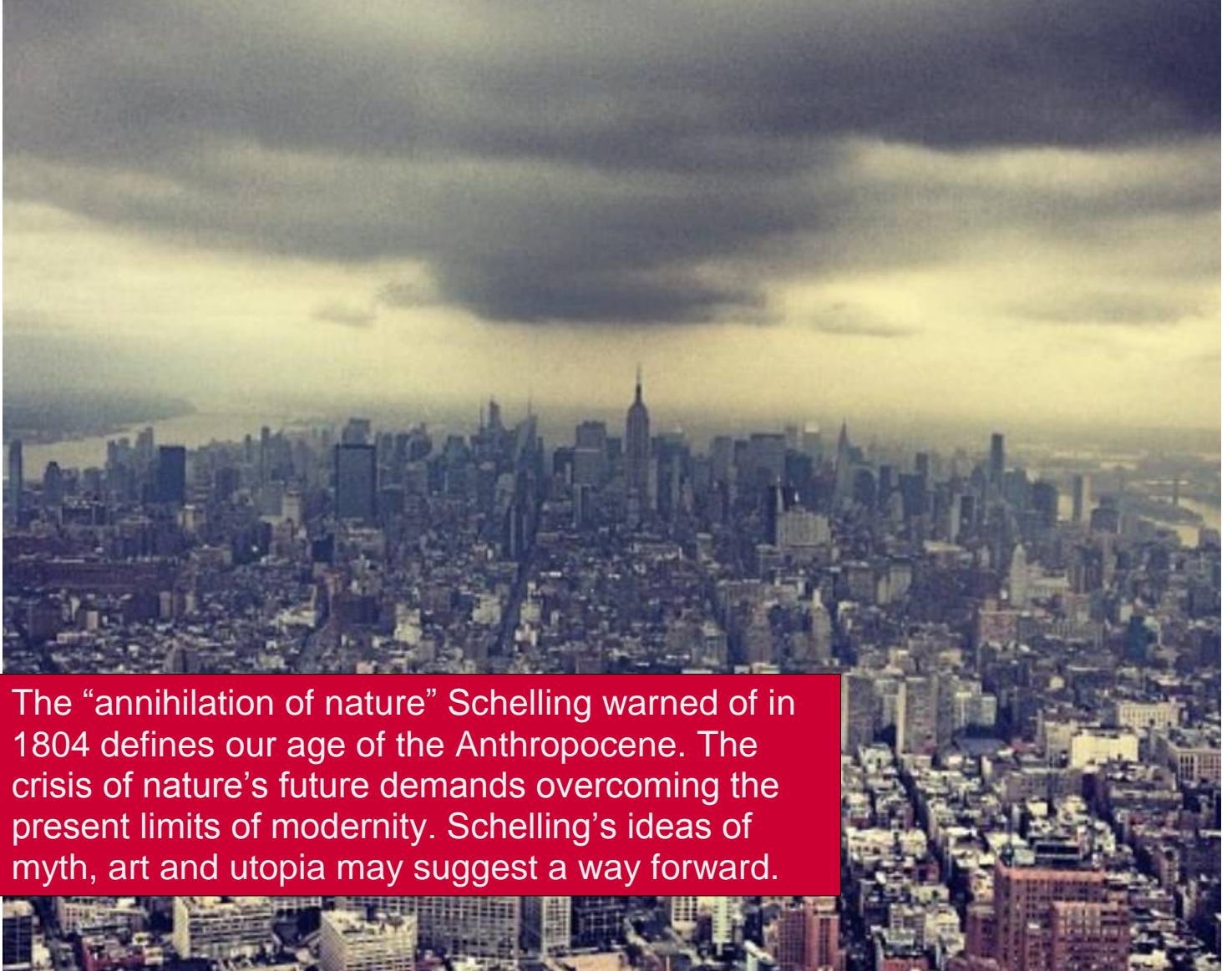


# SCHELLING IN THE ANTHROPOCENE
