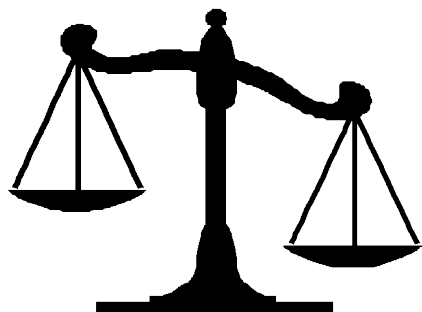


The Free Will Thesis
