#### Submission Guidelines

Submissions may be from any philosophical sub-field, and may address, e.g. metaphysical, epistemic, moral, or political issues concerning social phenomena, as well as questions regarding social phenomena in areas such as philosophy of science, philosophy of mind, or aesthetics. Suggested social groups and phenomena of interest may include but are not limited to the following:

- gender, sex, gender identity
- race, racial identity
- disability
- health, well-being, and the body
- sexuality, sexual orientation
- class, poverty, privilege
- immigration, illegalization, citizenship
- colonialism, decolonization
- science, technology, and values
- discrimination, bias, e.g. racism, ableism
- Papers should be prepared for anonymous review and submitted in .docx, .doc, or .pdf format to vt.gradphilclub@gmail.com
- Submissions may be up to 5,000 words in length
- Please submit a separate cover sheet that includes your name, contact information, institutional affiliation, keywords and relevant area(s) of research, and a short abstract of approximately 300 words
