- Transformations of social processes and social structures under the influence of digital and information technologies
- Epistemic aspects of media reality
- Sociology of the digital space

We invite philosophers, science studies researchers and other scholars investigating the role of the new digital and information technologies in contemporary science, technology and society.

Extended abstracts containing 500-700 words + keywords + info on author/s, affiliation/s and e-mail address/es can be send to Svetlana Shibarshina (Deputy Editor) by **October 1, 2018**. References do not count toward the word limit.

Notification of acceptance will follow in November, and submission of 1<sup>st</sup> drafts is foreseen for January 2019. All papers will be subjected to double blind peer review, and publication is foreseen in 2019.
