

Privacy Policy

1. Personal Data

If you register for the event "The Ethics of State Mass Surveillance", which will take place on 11 and 12 April 2019 in Karlsruhe, we will process your personal data. According to Art. 4 No. 1 of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), personal data are all data relating to an identified or identifiable natural person.

3. Data Processing

When you register as a participant, we collect the following personal data:

university affiliation
email address

We collect and store the data in order to identify you as a participant of the event and to contact you regarding the event.

4. Legal Basis

The legal basis for the processing is your consent in accordance with Art. 6, par. 1, clause 1, (a) GDPR. The consent is voluntary. There are no disadvantages if it is denied or withdrawn.

5. Data Storage

Your data will be stored for as long as necessary to carry out the event and there are statutory storage requirements. After expiry of the statutory retention periods (especially tax and commercial regulations) your data will be deleted unless you have expressly consented to any further use of the data. In general, the data is deleted after six months.

6. Your Rights

According to Art. 7 par. 3 GDPR you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time with effect for the future. The withdrawal may also refer to parts of your consent.

In addition you have the following rights regarding your personal data:

- Right of access (Article 15 GDPR)
- Right to rectification (Article 16 GDPR)
- Right to erasure (Article 17 GDPR)
- Right to restriction of processing (Article 18 GDPR)
- Right to data portability (Article 20 GDPR)

In addition, you have the right to complain about the processing of your personal data by us with a supervisory authority (Art. 77 GDPR).

In the case of manifestly unfounded or excessive requests, we can charge a reasonable fee. Otherwise, information will be provided free of charge (Art. 12, par. 5 GDPR).

In the case of reasonable doubts concerning the identity of the natural person asserting the above rights, we may request the provision of additional information necessary to confirm the identity of the data subject (Art. 12, par. 6 GDPR).
