The Latinx Philosophy Conference celebrates philosophical work by Latinx philosophers and philosophical work on issues relevant to Latinx and Latin American peoples. The conference aims to bring together philosophers working on a wide variety of topics, from a wide variety of philosophical and interdisciplinary traditions.

Abstracts and proposals for discussion panels on any area of philosophy, including (but not limited to) Epistemology, Ethics, Feminist Philosophy, History of Philosophy, Latin American Philosophy, Caribbean Philosophy, Metaphysics, Philosophy of Language, Philosophy of Mind, Philosophy of Race and Gender, Philosophy of Science, and Social and Political Philosophy are welcomed. We are particularly interested in papers and panels that bring philosophical thinking to bear on problems of concern for Latinx individuals and Latinx communities. We invite abstracts and panel proposals from students and scholars in any discipline.

Abstracts must be between 750-1000 words (with full papers suitable for a 30-minute presentation), and accompanied by a separate 1-paragraph synopsis of up to 150 words. Submissions should be sent as a PDF file to latinxphilosophyconference@gmail.com. In a separate PDF file, please include your name, academic affiliation, email address, and paper title.

Panel proposals must be between 1000-1500 words and should set out in some detail the focus of the proposed panel. Please only submit proposals if all proposed panelists have confirmed a willingness to attend if selected. Panels should include no more than four panelists. Panel proposals should be sent as a PDF to latinxphilosophyconference@gmail.com. In a separate PDF attachment, include the names of the proposed panelists, their academic affiliations, email addresses, and panel title.

All Submissions:

- All submissions should be prepared for anonymous review.
- Beneath the submission title, include:
 - Word count for the abstract or panel proposal (exclusive of endnotes and bibliography).
 - Primary subfield(s) under which your submission falls, plus 1-3 keywords.
 - E.g. Epistemology (testimonial injustice, social epistemology)
- There is a limit of one submission per author(s). This includes co-authors and panelists: a person who is a co-author of an abstract or panel proposal may not be a part of another submission.
