Submitted manuscripts must be original, unpublished works and may not be under consideration at another publication. A complete submission includes:

- A manuscript in Word or WordPerfect formats. Please do not submit PDFs.
- An abstract of no more than 150 words.

Manuscript Format: *Idealistic Studies* uses *The Chicago Manual of Style*, 17th edition. A helpful resource on *The Chicago Manual of Style* is available online here.

- Use endnotes, not embedded footnotes
- Text should be double spaced; Endnotes single space
- No page numbering
- No page formatting
- Use italics for emphasis and foreign word and phrases.

Manuscript Length The typical length of published articles is approximately 5,000 words. Submitted manuscripts should not exceed 10,000 words without prior discussion with the editor.
